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Getting Started

1.

Start the first chapter here. kaobook keeps a mini table of contents in the margin for every chapter, updated automatically from your section headings.

1.1. Sidenotes

Use a sidenote for anything that would break the flow of the main text¹ but is still worth keeping close to the point it supports.

1: Like this. It appears in the wide margin, roughly level with where it is called.

1.2. Cross-references

Refer back to earlier material with Chapter 1, or forward to Chapter 2 once it exists — kaorefs loads cleveref configured for kaobook's numbering.

1.3. Figures and tables

Figures and tables belong in the margin by default in this class — use `marginfigure` and `marginfigure` rather than the plain `figure/table` environments, which is also where kaobook's own caption styling is set up to work.²

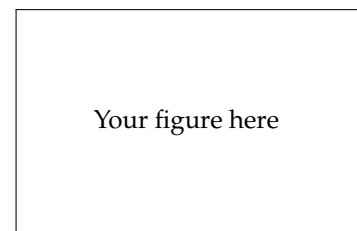


Figure 1.1.: A caption goes below the figure.

Figure 1.1 shows a placeholder. Replace the `fbox` with `\includegraphics`.

Table 1.1 shows the same idea for a table.

2: Plain `figure` and `table` still typeset, but the class does not style their captions the way it styles a margin float's — use `pagelayout{wide}` instead if you want a full-width figure.
